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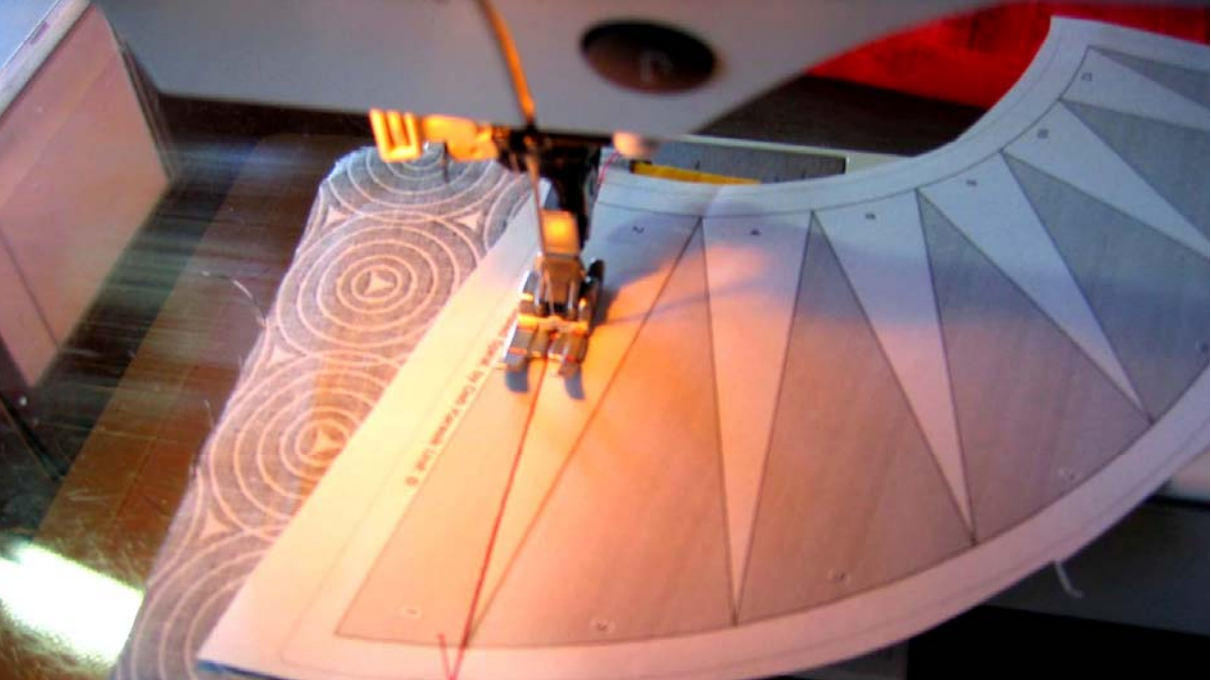
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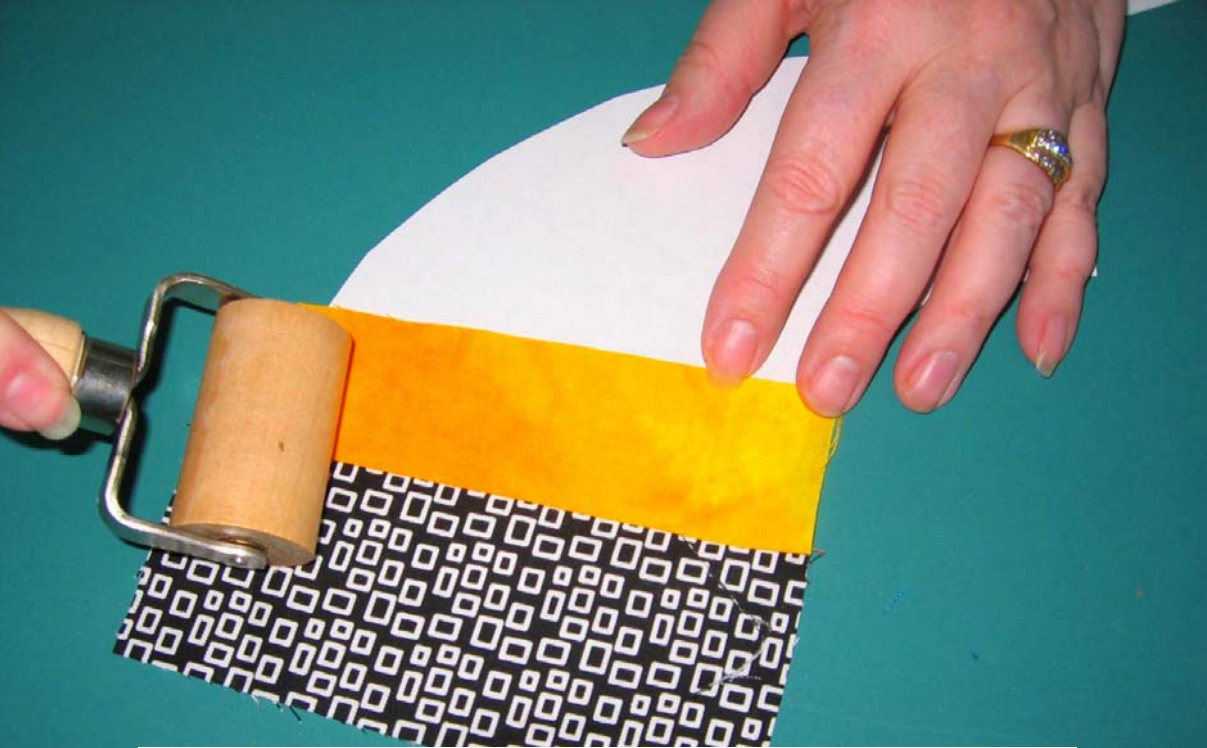
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1. With right sides together, line up one edge of the fabric, as shown.



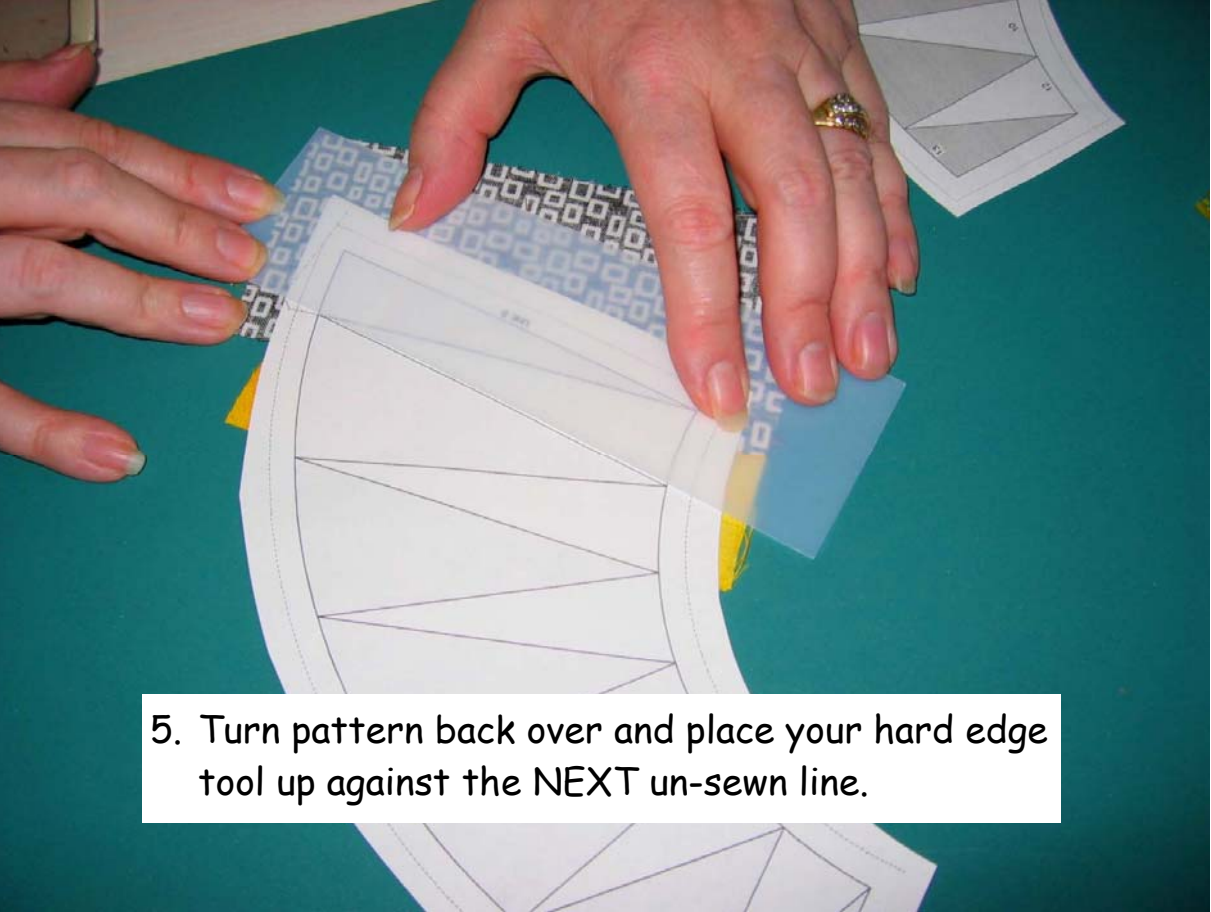
2. With the **back** of the background fabric being the first thing to touch the **back** of the paper, line up the edges approximately 1/4" past the first sewing line.



3. Using a tight stitch, (approx. 1.5 st/in), start at the outer cutting line and sew on the first sewing line out to the other cutting line.



4. Turn pattern over and press seam open, as shown.

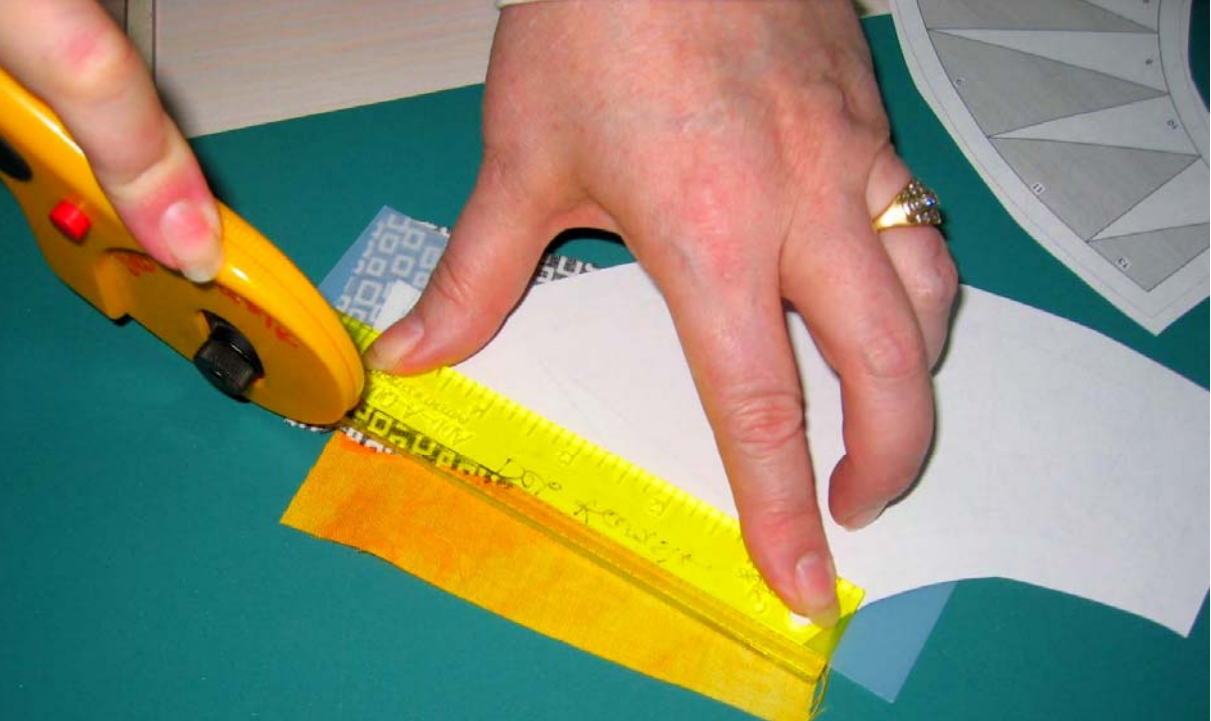


5. Turn pattern back over and place your hard edge tool up against the NEXT un-sewn line.





6. Fold pattern back against hard edge tool.



7. Line up the Add A Quarter ruler with the edge of the paper and trim away excess.



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8. Turn it back over and it will look like this. Now...simply line up the next background piece up to the edge of this piece and keep going! Easy, eh?
